## The Divine Mercy - Novena and the Feast

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is a relatively recent but very popular devotion revealed by Our Lord to **St. Maria Faustina Kowalska**, a Polish nun. On February 22nd, 1931 Christ Jesus appeared to St. Faustina and revealed the Image with rays radiating from His heart and said, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and throughout the world." (*Diary* 47)

- I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over its enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I myself will defend it as My own glory. (*Diary* 48)
- I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature": Jesus, I trust in You." (*Diary* 327)
- The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red
  ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender
  mercy when My agonized heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My
  Father. Happy is the one who dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him. (Diary 299)
- Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush, lies the greatness of this image, but in My grace. (*Diary* 313)
- By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works. (*Diarv*742)

On Good Friday 1937, Christ Jesus appeared to her and asked her to recite this chaplet for nine days, starting on <u>Good Friday</u> and ending on the Octave of Easter (the Sunday after <u>Easter Sunday</u>), now known as **Divine Mercy Sunday or The Feast of Mercy**. The chaplet is most often recited during those nine days, but it can be prayed at any time of the year, and Saint Maria Faustina recited it almost unceasingly.

Concerning the **Feast of Mercy** Jesus said:

- Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (Diary300)
- I want the image solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that
  every soul may know about it. (Diary 341)
- This Feast emerged from the very depths of My mercy, and it is confirmed in the vast depths of my tender mercies. (Diary420)
- I want to grant complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy. (Diary 1109)

St. John in his first letter insists on the presence of the invisible with the visible, the Spirit with the water and the Blood. The Image of the pierced side of Christ pouring out blood and water reminds us that the Cross, love in action, is the price of mercy. "As I have loved you so also should you love one anoth-
